



Recommendation

It is recommended that your Board:

A. Approve the attached insurance proposals for the renewal of the general, auto, and other liability coverage and approve the proposal from the Joint Powers Risk and Insurance Management Authority (JPRIMA) in the annual amount of \$34,324.

B. Authorize a check disbursement of \$34,324 for insurance coverage.

Discussion

The District's liability insurance broker has been Tolman & Wiker, Insurance Services, LLC since approximately 2001. They have recently completed their review of liability insurance options for the District and have submitted cost proposals that are included in the attachments. The renewal of District's liability insurance for 2022 will total \$34,324, which is an increase of \$4,757 (16%) in comparison to the District's 2021 cost of \$29,567.

The following is a summary of liability insurance costs for each of the past thirteen years, and for 2001 when Tolman & Wiker became the District's liability insurance broker. In 2017 the District saved 8.6% by moving from the WaterPlus Program to the current provider JPRIMA. The current quote is 85% of the 2013 cost of insurance, which was \$40,201.

Recommendation

It is recommended that your Board:

1. Receive a presentation on the Board selected focus maps for division boundaries

2. Conduct a Public Hearing to consider the Board selected focus maps

3. Select a final map and election sequencing for adoption at the subsequent Public Hearing

Discussion

On September 9, 2020, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2020-11 declaring its intention to transition from at-large to division-based elections for the Board of Directors commencing with the General Election in November 2022. Elections Code Section 10010 provides that before any map or maps of the boundaries for the proposed divisions are drawn, the District must conduct two (2) Public Hearings over a period of no more than thirty (30) days, at which time the public is invited to provide input regarding the composition of said divisions.

Those Public Hearings were held on June 9 and 23, 2021. The Public Hearing Notice was published in English and Spanish and mailed to each District customer of record. The Notice was also posted at the District Office and on the District Facebook page.

The purpose of those Public Hearings was to inform the public about the division creation process and to hear from the community on what factors should be taken into consideration while creating division boundaries.

The public was requested to provide input regarding communities of interest and other local factors that should be considered while drafting division maps. A *community of interest* is a neighborhood or group that would benefit from being in the same division because of shared interests, views, or characteristics. Possible community features include, but are not limited to:



Board of Directors Meeting

- A. School attendance areas;
- B. Natural dividing lines such as major roads, hills, or highways;
- C. Areas around parks and other neighborhood landmarks;
- D. Common issues, neighborhood activities, or legislative/election concerns; and
- E. Shared demographic characteristics, such as:
- (1) Similar levels of income, education, or linguistic insolation;
- (2) Languages spoken at home; and
- (3) Single-family and multi-family housing unit areas.

The District must ensure compliance with the following state and federally-mandated criteria:

- Each division must contain a nearly equal population.
- Each division must be drawn in a manner that complies with the Federal Voting Rights Act.
- Each division must not be drawn with race as the predominate factor in violation of the principles established by the U.S. Supreme Court in Shaw v. Reno, 509 U.S. 630 (1993), and its progeny.

A public workshop was held on February 9, 2022, to show the public how to draw their own maps and submit them for consideration. The deadline for map submittal was February 25, 2022. The attached draft division maps were submitted by members of the public and created by the District's demographer. In total, nine maps were submitted by members of the public and three were drawn by the demographer. These were posted to the District website and made available at the District Office on March 2, 2022, along with proposed election sequencing.

A third Public Hearing was held on March 9, 2022, to take public input on the submitted draft maps and provide direction on which maps to further consider or make amendments to for a March 23, 2022, Public Hearing. The Board selected three maps to consider for adoption at this Public Hearing, which is Public Hearing #4. These are attached as Plan 202 Map, Plan 502 Map, and Plan 503 Map. The Board can select a final map for adoption, or direct amendments as necessary at this Public Hearing.

Next Steps

If the Board selects a final map without any amendments, a fifth Public Hearing will be held immediately following this Public Hearing. If any amendments are made to a map, this would require the amended map to be posted for seven days prior to any Public Hearing, which would be scheduled for April 13, 2022, to adopt the final map. The deadline for map submittal to the County Elections Official is April 17, 2022.

District staff and the demographer will then work with the County Elections Official to have the division maps integrated into the countywide voting system. The first by- division election will be held in November 2022.

Financial Considerations

There is no fiscal impact associated with this public hearing. However, transitioning to division elections required the District to retain the services of a demographer. The District has retained National Demographics Corporation for these services. The cost of such services should be approximately \$20,000-\$25,000. Should the District ultimately transition to a division-based electoral system, the District will not be exposed to the potentially much higher legal fees involved in defense of a lawsuit brought under the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA).

Results

Compliance with the CVRA helps to ensure a well governed community.

Dear Oceano Community Services District Board (OCSD),

The Oceano Advisory Council (OAC) is writing to request the following consideration on the district mapping project the CSD is working through:

Having learned at the last OCSD meeting that the "Mapping Tool" program was giving false variable information to the public when submitting their maps (as explained by the representative of the mapping company in attendance that evening), we ask that that either the deadline to submit maps be extended by two weeks, or, at the least, the previously submitted maps that exhibit a larger deviance than shown on the Map Tool program are allowed a two-week period to resubmit with needed changes in order to be in compliance.

The public did not get to learn of this Mapping Tool discrepancy until the night the OCSD was choosing the maps already submitted. Your own paid consultant said this option of leaving the deadline open for a small window of time is well within your power to decide. We consider this extension to be fair to the very residents who are affected by the upcoming redistricting, and we look forward to the Oceano Community Services District being an advocate for the very community it represents.

The OAC discussed this concern at length and voted unanimously, with Chair Villa and member White not voting at all in order to not have any appearance of conflict. This small change will allow the pool of map choices to be expanded and to be a much more accurate representation

of the public participation that occurred and for that, Oceano will only be better by the residents' involvement.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT ESTABLISHING VOTING DIVISIONS FOR ELECTIONS AND DEFINING DIVISION BOUNDARIES PURSUANT TO ELECTIONS CODE SECTIONS 10010 AND 10650

WHEREAS, the Oceano Community Services District ("District") currently elects and is governed by five board members using an at-large election system; and

WHEREAS, subdivision (a) of Elections Code section 10650 authorizes a special district to, by resolution, require that the members of its governing body be elected using division-based elections without being required to submit the resolution to the voters for approval, in furtherance of the purposes of the California Voting Rights Act of 2001 ("CVRA"); and

WHEREAS, at its September 9, 2020, meeting, the District adopted Resolution No. 2020-11, a resolution of intent to establish a by-division voting process pursuant to Government Code section 10010, and the District subsequently hired a demographer to assist in the process; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Elections Code section 10010, the District held two (2) public hearings (June 9, 2021 and June 23, 2021) before any maps of voting divisions were drawn, at which time input from the public on the proposed composition of the voting divisions was invited and heard; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2022, nine (9) voting maps were presented and discussed at a public hearing at which the public was invited to provide input regarding communities of interest and other local factors; and

WHEREAS, on March 23, 2022, the District held a fourth public hearing to consider three (3) focus maps selected from the original nine (9) voting maps, and public input was again invited and heard, and the District Board made a final map selection to be brought back to the Board for adoption; and

WHEREAS, it is the position of the District Board of Directors that the map attached hereto as Exhibit A, will best serve the interests of the Oceano Community Services District and is consistent with the California Voting Rights Act and applicable law; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Resolution is to enact, pursuant to Government Code section 10650, a resolution providing for the by-division election of the Directors of the Board of Directors of the Oceano Community Services District; and

WHEREAS, all other legal prerequisites to the adoption of this Resolution have occurred.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT BE RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTSRICT THAT:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 2. To further the purposes of the California Voting Rights Act of 2001, the Board of Directors of the Oceano Community Services District hereby approves the division boundary map included as Exhibit "A" to this Resolution.
- 3. Beginning with the November 2022 election, members of the Board shall be elected on a division-based electoral system from five single-member Board divisions as shown on the attached map and in accordance with the election sequencing as identified on Exhibit "A".
- 4. The General Manager and District Legal Counsel are hereby authorized and directed to take the steps necessary to implement this Resolution.
- 5. This Resolution is effective on the day of its adoption.
